CCE Board Meeting

Those in attendance: Jerry Berger-President, Kirk Parro-Vice President and Activities Coordinator, Ray Morales-Treasurer, Rick Korthauer-Secretary, Sandy Stricker-Director at Large and Historical Committee, Bo Lester-Hot line, Charley Biddle-Airhorn Editor. CCE members-Bill Stricker, Kathy Jensen and Harry Jensen.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM.

Jerry asked if there was any CCE letterhead stationary in the old style on hand as he wanted to send out letters in February to companies for possible donations of goods or services for raffle prizes for the OAP. Ray said that he would make some available to Jerry ASAP.

President Jerry Berger was presented with a new briefcase from the membership of CCE. Ray Morales acting on behalf of the membership made the presentation saying, "Don't go beating this one up as it will have to be passed over to the next CCE president". There was much laughter.

Bill Stricker said that the Chevy Vette Fest spring dates have been moved back to March from April and that he

was thinking that it might be difficult to get the necessary eight Corvair vehicles lined up. He will see if the promoters will adjust the eight car limit to six cars. He said that he will ask for more CCE club participants at the January general membership meeting.

Jerry said that he is going to have a new 'Fun' funds raiser at the January general membership meeting. He said that an image of himself is in a photo montage and this photo is on a television program that is aired on a weekly basis. He said that he would give people a chance to guess but that they would have to pay one dollar for each guess. The participants would have to guess the name of the show and the photo in question. If there is a correct answer the prize would be \$20 of Jerry's own money. The proceeds would go to the general funds of the CCE. He said that the contest will continue until he is no longer president or until someone correctly guesses. Jerry was very coy with the board of directors when they tried to guess ahead of time. Some board member mentioned that they thought it might be a cartoon show for sure. There was much laughter.

Sandy Stricker said that the Historical Committee met on January 2nd rather than December 30th. She said that they had a real good time and that the scrapbooks were nearly finished. She said that the committee will begin to meet two times a month. Rick asked her to be sure to advertise the dates and times so others could join in the fun. Sandy said that one meeting would be on the third Saturday of each month unless it coincided with a holiday such as March 17th, St. Patrick's day. She said that the other meeting in the month would be floating around the calendar so that as many folks as possible could attend. Kirk said that he would be happy to make sure that the dates of the historical committee meetings show up in the activities calendar.

Sandy said that she wanted to get together with John Meyer to talk about the CCE website. This started discussion about the email programs and server lists. There was talk about exclusive and non-exclusive emails and we talked about how CCE's website is hosted by the CORSA computers in Virginian state. Harry Jensen said that many other Corvair chapters have email and news letters on line through CORSA's computers for their members. Jerry said that this looked like an interesting thing to look into.

The discussion then focused around the *Airhorn* and its possibility of being available to members on line in either a PDF file by either push or pull (too technical even for your secretary to understand). The fact was brought up that maybe a few members would not pay their dues if they could just receive the newsletter on line for free. Ray Morales said that the cost of postage was around \$1,100 dollars every year and that it would give the clubs finances a bit of a break if some folks would choose to receive their *Airhorn* via email. Sandy suggested that it might be a good time to poll the members about this idea. More discussion followed until Jerry said that we talked about this issue enough. He said that he will mention the issue in his article for the *Airhorn* and mention about the possibility of having a survey. Bill Stricker suggested that the question of

would people like to receive the *Airhorn* via email might be on the sign in sheet at the general membership meeting. Rick said that he would make sure that that would happen.

Sandy Stricker asked for a break. Break was taken.

Jerry Berger called the meeting back to order.

Jerry brought the board back to the continuing discussion of the by-laws updates to the CCE constitution. Sandy Stricker thanked Harry Jensen for coming to the board of directors with his concerns about the proposed changes. There was much discussion about the wording of the by-laws proposal.

The issues that needed more discussion were general membership meetings procedures, annual budgeting procedures and what member's rights are. After more discussion, the by-laws were scrapped and Harry Jensen stated that he would insert language reflecting what the board had discussed into a modified version of the entire CCE constitution. Harry will highlight the changes in red and duly note any excluded language. This version of the constitution will be available for CCE members to look at during the January 17 meeting.

Jerry asked for any other business.

Rick asked if Larry Claypool was contacted so he could be ready for the What Is It? contest for the January general membership meeting. Jerry said he would make that happen.

Bo said that the contract with the entertainment for the March anniversary dinner is just about completed.

Meeting adjourned 9:05 PM.

General Membership Meeting Minutes

January 17, 2007

Meeting started at 7:40 PM.

Thirty three members signed in, several arrived later and some were in the bar.

Question of the month: "Do you have an email account?" and would you be interested in receiving the *Airhorn* in an email?

Question of the month totals are: Yes-17, No-13.

For once President Jerry Berger started the meeting without telling a joke, rather he started the meeting by reading a humorous guide on how to decipher what a used car ad is really saying. There was much laughter for a change.

Jerry asked if there were any guests or new members present for the first time. Noah Swanson introduced himself. Noah has been a member for two years and has three Corvairs. He has a 1963 convertible, a 1964 Rampside and a 1965 Corsa. Noah hopes to get at least one of them into running condition soon.

Jerry Berger announced that he is conducting a contest as a fund raiser for the CCE. He said that a photo of himself is in a photo montage that is seen on a weekly basis on a broadcast television program. He said that he would give people a chance to guess but that they would have to pay

one dollar for each guess. The participant would have to write the name of the show and the photo on a piece of paper and send it to him or to him via the CCE club. If there is a correct answer the winner will receive twenty dollars of Jerry's own money. He said that the contest will end when someone correctly guesses or when he is no longer CCE President.

Jerry explained what the 'Question of the Month' on the sign in sheet was all about. The sign-in sheet is passed around at the beginning of each CCE general membership meeting.

Motion to approve the previous minutes were made by Dennis Arendt, seconded by Roy Hill, and the motion passed.

Treasurer Ray Morales reported \$3,103.85 in CCE checking and overall total of money in club accounts as \$13,879.09. Ray said that there were no major club expenses expected for January.

Charley Biddle made the *Airhorn* report. Articles for the February issue are due January 24th.

Larry Claypool presented the membership report. Larry said that dues are coming in at a steady pace. The address label on each *Airhorn* will reflect if the member's dues are current. Larry said that just a few labels slipped past his watchful eyes with wrong information and that he would correct them for the February issue of the *Airhorn*. Larry then announced that he had with him a box of stainless steel Phillips head screws that he said anyone could have for *free-free-free*.

Harry Jensen presented the CORSA report along with Larry Claypool. Harry talked about the upcoming CORSA Convention in Detroit. Harry said that the host hotel was going to ding the credit card account for one night of anyone who makes a reservation for the convention. Harry said that this measure is being taken because of the problem in the past of reservations not being honored and other folks who might have wanted rooms being turned away. Larry explained that this convention would be a rare chance for those of us in the Midwest to experience the wonders of a CORSA Convention. "It's only a five hour drive, folks", he said. Harry then gave a thumb's nail schedule of the events at the convention.

There was no Library report.

The historic committee report was given by Lin Parro. Lin says that the 2005 CCE history book was done and that the 2006 is underway. Rick Korthauer asked Lin when the committee would be meeting next. She said that the committee will try to meet on the third Saturday of each month unless there was a holiday conflict and that the second meeting each month would be floated around the monthly calendar.

Jerry asked if there were any other events that members might like to be aware of. JR Read said that there would be ice racing on Dollar Lake near Eagle Rivers, Wisconsin, on the weekend of February 3-4th and on Sinissippi Lake the weekend of February 10-11th. Larry talked about a car event near Jacksonville, Florida, on Amelia Island on the weekend of March 10-11th. He said that it is a premier car show well worth the forty dollars that is required to just

look at the automobiles. He went on to say that there would be, displayed for the first time at this prestigious event, a collection of 'special bodied' Corvairs. "It would be a great event for any of you folks here tonight, who are snowbirds, and find yourselves in Florida at that time", he said.

Bill Stricker is still hopeful that there would be enough Corvair owners that would be willing to sign up for Chevy Vette Fest for March. "I'll be asking the promoters if they can change the eight car rule", he said. Bill asked anyone interested to see him during the break.

Jerry Berger announced that the CCE board of directors had canceled the proposed by-laws change to the constitution as written and that the process has been started over. He went on to say the board of directors spent some time to address the by-law wordings at their January board of directors meeting and concluded that the constitution needed certain wordings changed to reflect the issues of concern. Harry Jensen took a copy the CCE constitution and made the wording changes in red and duly noted any deletions. There were eight copies for CCE members to look at during the break. Then there was a question asked if the whole constitution with changes should be published and sent to the membership separately or with the *Airhorn*. Burt Neuner suggested that members with email might have the ability to download the constitution. Jerry Berger asked folks to volunteer their email address tonight if this interested them. JR Read suggested that the document could be sent as a PDF file. Jerry assured the membership that the whole constitution issue would be slow and deliberate so as to be sure that it was done right and that all opinions are sure to be heard.

Jerry reminded *everyone* to be mindful of the March 24th Awards Banquet dinner.

He asked everyone who was interested in participating in the 'What Is It?' contest to look at the parts on the table during the break.

Break was called.

After break, Jerry called the meeting back to order and then let Larry Claypool take over as game show host of 'What Is It?'. Game Show Host Larry was assisted by Burt Neuner. There were some very unusual parts from which to guess from. Everyone had a chance to look over the parts during the break. After all of the parts were shown and their purposes were revealed, the participants were asked by Larry to add up the points of their correct guesses. There was a tie for the most correct guesses and it was between Ray Johnson and JR Read. No prizes were given except the bragging rights for knowing a lot about Corvairs.

Paul Dehnert reminded *everyone* about the Sweets Auction that takes place at the February Chicagoland Corvair Enthusiast general membership meeting.

What Is It Answers

These are the answers for the first part of the What Is It contest.

1. Oil dipstick, any Spyder. The handle is flat metal stock (early models), chrome plated (Spyder, only).
2. Stone shields for either sides of rear grill on all '64 models.
3. Heater hose sleeve, left hose by starter. Prevents heater hose internal reinforcement wires from contacting starter contacts. '61 to '64 all, early '65, and all FCs.
4. Pressure regulator for gas heater, limits to 4.5 to 5.5 psi. Can be adjusted.
5. Rear grill reinforcement rod, wagons, Spyderys, '60s, right side only. These models had straight out exhaust pipes, thru body cut-outs. This particular one is from a Spyder.
6. Door lock release knob, '67 only.
7. Letters R from '64 only hood and deck lid C-O-R-V-A-I-R letters. The one with the rounded stud is from later '64, front. The one with rectangular stud is from all '64 rear and early '64 front.
8. Fuel filter spring, Rochester carbs.
9. Side marker light bulb, number 194A, '68 only, amber in color. Lens was clear in '68 only.
10. Accessory wiring harness, '60 and '61 with gas heater or radio. The light bulb socket is for the heater control.
11. Late model dashboard brace, with factory air, compensates for wider AC controls cutout in dashboard.

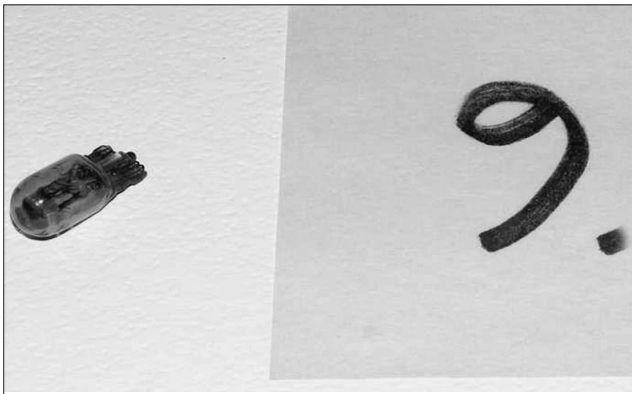
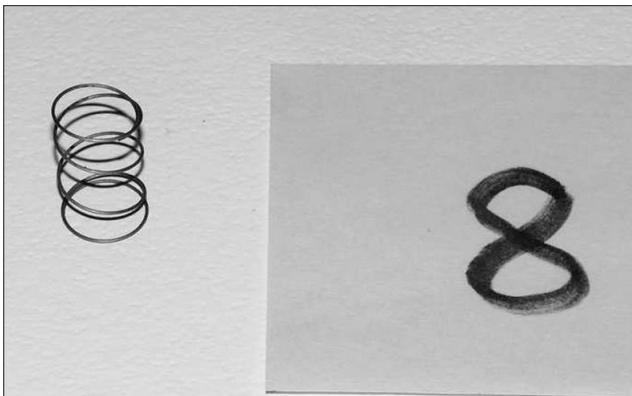
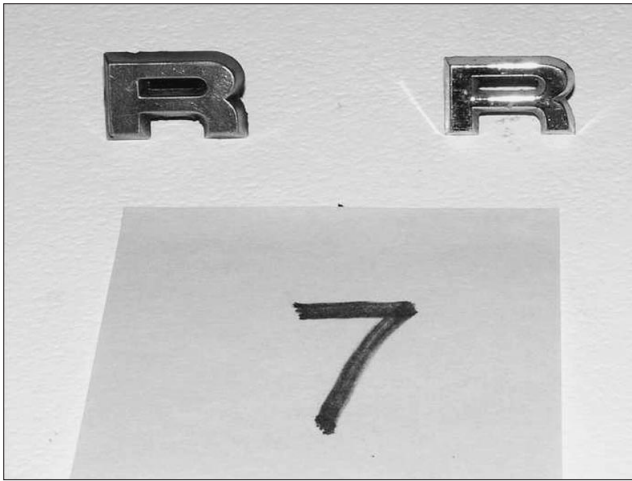
What Is It Contest
